Answers

1. Did Davy think Stephenson's safety lamp was safe?

No. Davy wrote 'I do not think it safe', and 'I fear [Stephenson] may endanger the lives of the workmen'.

- 2. What does Davy call Stephenson? Underline three answers: his friend; <u>a thief;</u> generous; <u>ignorant</u>; <u>a pirate</u>; knowledgeable.
- 3. Why is the word 'pirate' used?

Piracy is 'The unauthorized reproduction or use of an invention or work of another' (OED).

- 4. What did Stephenson say in his letters? Underline three answers: <u>Stephenson did not have as much money as Davy to buy 'beautiful instruments'</u> (scientific equipment); Stephenson copied Davy's ideas; <u>Davy had the same idea as Stephenson</u>; somebody told Stephenson about Davy's ideas; <u>Stephenson did not receive any hint about Davy's experiments</u>; Stephenson had enough money to buy scientific equipment of his own.
