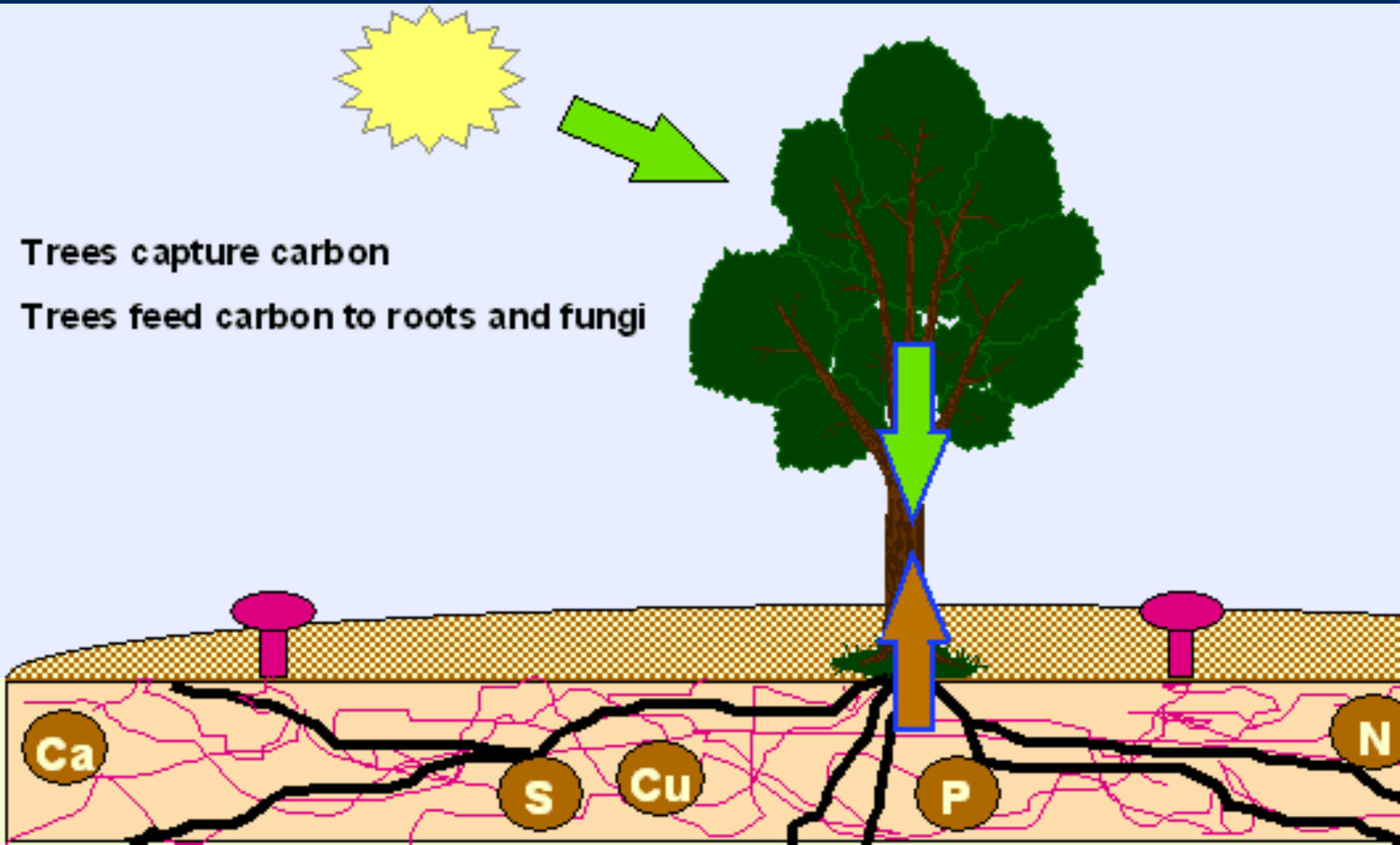
Scholars (Stibbe, 2003; Linzey, 2006) have suggested that industry discourse characterizes animals in ways that objectify them and obscure morally relevant characteristics such as animal sentience.

It may be necessary to reconsider several aspects of animal production relative to ideology, discourse, and practice...a real ethic of care and respect for animals must be embodied not just in our practices but also in the internal and external discourse of animal agriculture.

OLD ECONOMICS

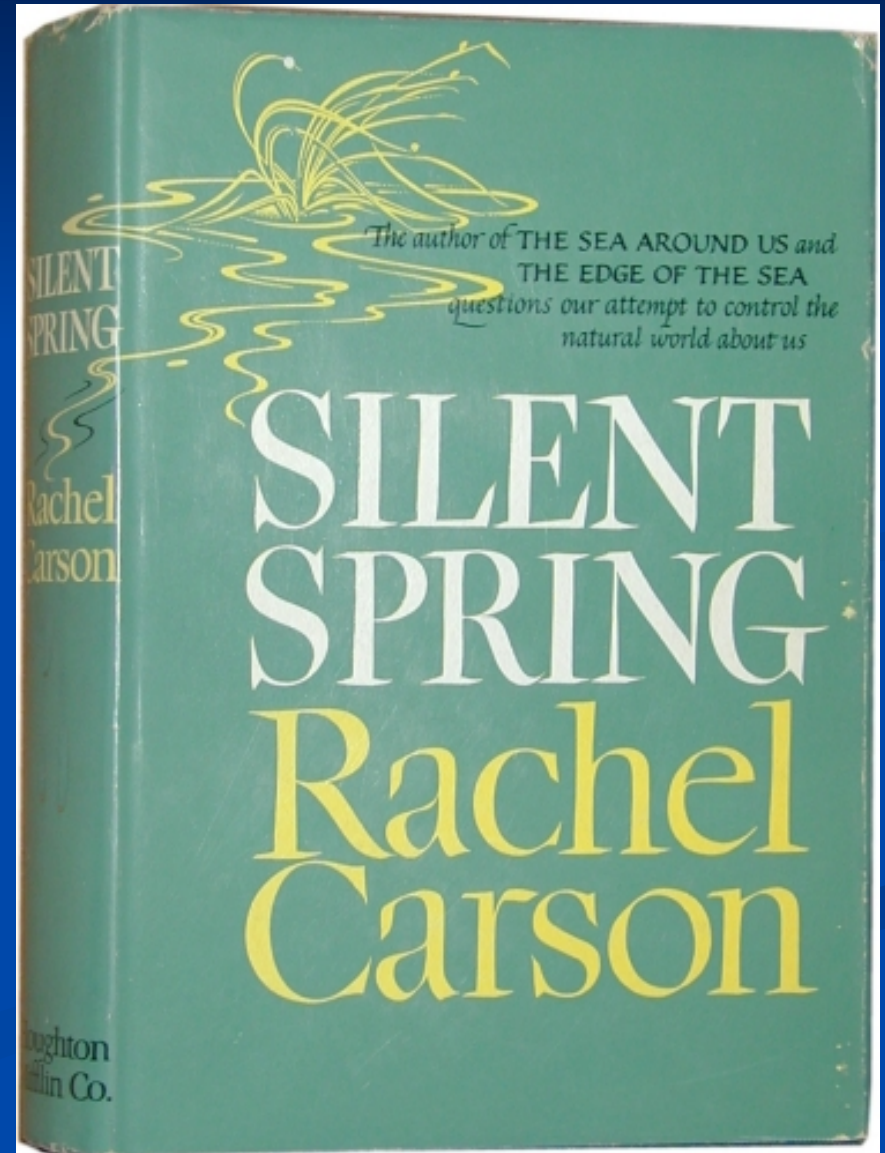
- ◆ consumers maximise their satisfaction through purchase

Transition Discourse





The Dark Mountain





We live in a time of social, economic and ecological unravelling. All around us are signs that our whole way of living is already passing into history.



- ◆ We believe that the roots of these crises lie in the stories we have been telling ourselves. We intend to challenge the stories which underpin our civilisation: the myth of progress, the myth of human centrality, and the myth of our separation from 'nature'. These myths are more dangerous for the fact that we have forgotten they are myths.
- ◆ Humans are not the point and purpose of the planet. Our art will begin with the attempt to step outside the human bubble. By careful attention, we will reengage with the non-human world...

Political correctness

- ◆ 'bacon, ham, pork → 'pig flesh'
- ◆ 'pork producer' → 'pig enslaver'
- ◆ 'cull' is 'murder'
- ◆ 'farm' → 'confinement facility'
- ◆ farmer → 'nonhuman-animal exploiter'
- ◆ animal X other-than-human-being
- ◆ wild animal → free living non-human,
non-"domesticated" nonhuman (Dunayer)



'You mean at a fast food counter it would list "murdered bovine with brutally massacred swine strips" when all I want is a bacon burger? What a JOKE!' (respondent)

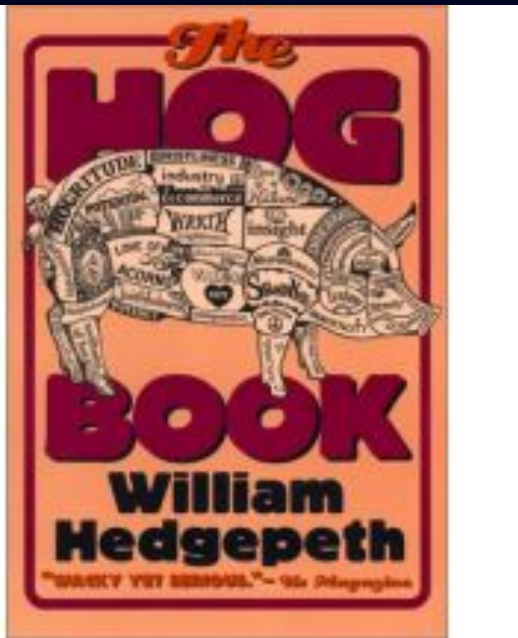
Poetic activism

- ◆ **Richard Rorty** appreciates 'the power of language to make new and different things possible and important - an appreciation which becomes possible only when one's aim becomes an expanding repertoire of alternative descriptions rather than 'The One Right Description'

- ◆ **Kenneth Gergen** While verbal hygiene represents its prescribed alternatives as more accurate, truthful or 'correct', poetic activism promotes 'provocative and compelling ways of talking and writing, that unsettle common sense, taken for granted realities, and invite others into new dialogic spaces'

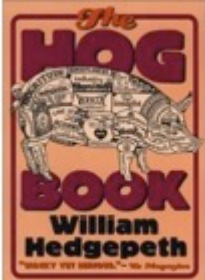
- ◆ **Gary Snyder:** It may be argued that what language does to our seeing of reality is restrictive, narrowing, limiting, and possibly misleading. “The menu is not the meal.” But rather than dismiss language we must instead turn right back *to* language. The way to see *with* language, to be free with it is to know mind and language extremely well and to play with their many possibilities

- ◆ **David Abram:** There can be no question of simply abandoning literacy, of turning away from all writing. Our task, rather, is that of *taking up* the written word, with all of its potency, and patiently, carefully, writing language back into the land. Our craft is that of releasing the budded, earthy intelligence of our words, freeing them to respond to the speech of the things themselves - to the green uttering-forth of leaves from the spring branches.

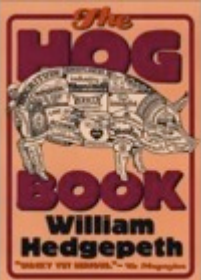


"Hog," to many people means any obscenely rotund beast with a tropism for mud who trundles filthily along oinking (Hedgepeth 1998, 21)

We rely upon the hog in many ways for support and for a sense of definition - definition of ourselves, for instance, as presumably superior, handsomer and all-round more legitimate creatures. It's in this way that we subconsciously employ the hog (ibid 200)



- ◆ The all-pervasive essence of Hog had resonated across time and insinuated itself deep into...our collective mind. [We are] awaiting some hopeful opportunity to transcend ourselves... [and pigs provide]...an ideal agent for inducing us to break our narrow containments...and thereby scale new heights of enlightenment and psychic liberation



- ◆ And so we go on about the routine exploitation of our hogs in the name of Agriculture or Industry & Commerce or Cheaper Pork; and in the end it all contributes to the vast-scale devaluation of life itself, for one cannot deny the legitimacy of another creature without diminishing one's own (Hedgepeth 1998:199)

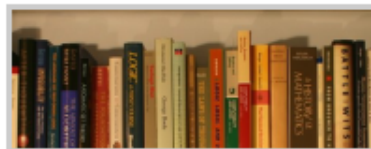
