Getting to and around campus



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Overview: Lancaster University campus

Please see the main University website for [campus maps and other information for visitors](#). Lancaster University campus has a **North Spine** (below: the purple dashed line) and a **South Spine** (below: orange line) that runs across the campus.

To navigate campus, we recommend using [MazeMap](#), which functions much like Google Maps but with additional information such as the locations of rooms, visitor parking, EV charging points, stairs/lifts and toilets. You can use [MazeMap](#) to create directions for yourself to help find the building/room from wherever you are on campus.

To find out the most **accessible routes** on campus, you can use [AccessAble](#). This allows you to check for accessible parking, toilets, lifts and a range of other important features on campus.

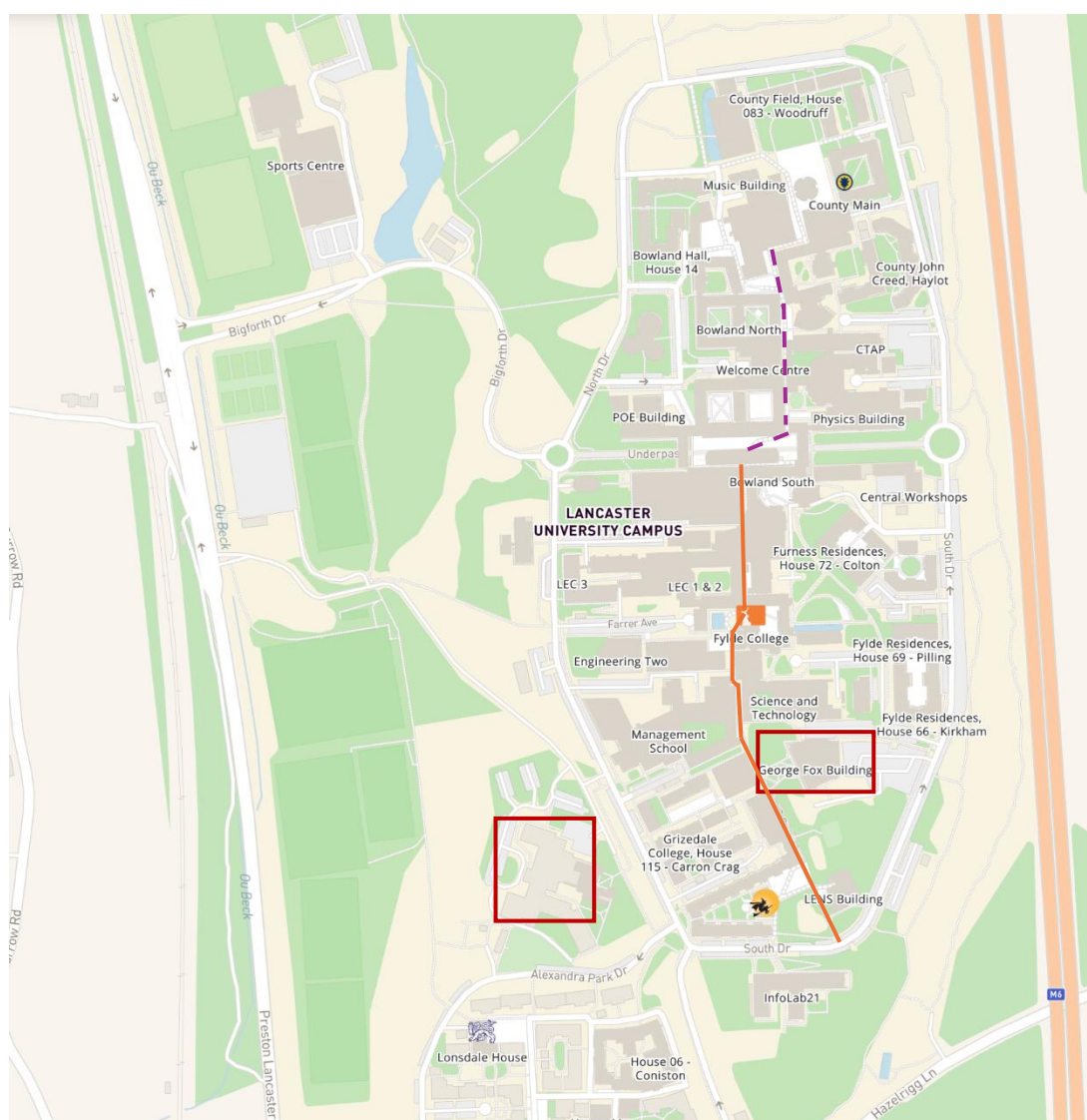


Figure 1. Map of Lancaster University campus, with the conference venue (George Fox) and conference dinner venue (Lancaster House Hotel) shown with red squares. South spine shown with an orange line and north spine shown with a purple dashed line.

Campus conference venues

Conference venue: George Fox

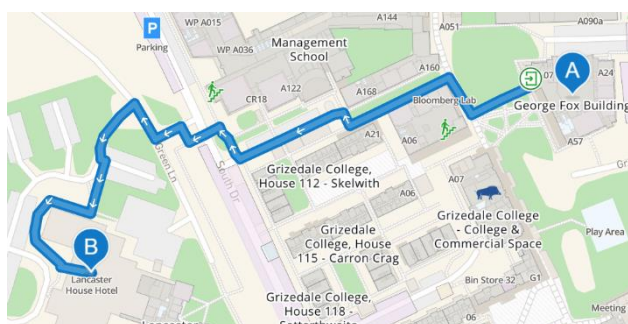


Conference meal venue: Lancaster House Hotel

Travelling to and from campus

Car parking

- Parking costs are included in your conference ticket. Please provide your car's registration number in the morning of the first day to a member of the conference team to ensure free parking. If you will not be present for the first morning and would like free parking, please get in touch with Emma Putland (e.putland@lancaster.ac.uk) by 9am Monday 22nd June (UK time).
- You can use [MazeMap](#) to identify the most convenient car parking facilities for your destination. Visitors can park in any Main Campus parking zone.

Getting the bus

Local bus services to the University campus are operated by [Stagecoach Cumbria and North Lancashire](#). Service **1/1A** provides a direct connection to the University every 10 minutes, Services **100, 4, 4X, 40, 41** and **42** also serve the University, giving a total of 14 buses per hour from Monday to Saturday until 7pm. A less frequent service then runs daily until around midnight.

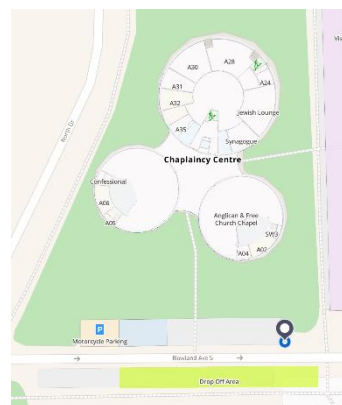
All buses (except 40 or 41) drop off and collect passengers at Lancaster University Bus Station, situated underneath Alexandra Square in the centre of campus. Since it is underground, this stop is more often referred to as the **Underpass**. We recommend using this bus stop during the conference as buses stop here the most regularly.

Using Taxis

Local taxi operators include:

Facilities on campus

You can find all of the campus outlets (shops, pharmacy, cafés, etc.) [here](#). Some of the options on campus include (but are by no means limited to):

- **Barkers (Cartmel College)** - Barkers is an old farm house, serving classic pub grub along with Starbucks coffee.
- **Coastal & Co** – a local family business that sells ethical coffee, cold drinks, toasties, cakes and pastries (vegan and gluten free available), waffles and local ice-cream.
- **Café Republic** – this offers tea, coffee and cakes and shares a space with Pizzetta Republic
- **Chains:** Costa Coffee, Greggs, Subway
- **The Deli** – this offers homemade healthy food, cakes and coffee/tea.
- **Guan Zi Restaurant** – this is a Chinese restaurant selling a variety of Asian cuisines. It's handily located in the George Fox building!
- **Grizedale bar** – this is Lancaster University's on-campus cocktail bar, located in Grizedale College.
- **JuiCafe** – a specialist coffee bar, with award winning smoothies, luxury milkshakes, fresh daily soups made in store and a wide range of vegan and gluten free options.
- **KC's African & Caribbean Cuisine** – you can see their Instagram page [here](#).
- **Sultan of Lancaster Experience** - a food outlet that specialises in grilled foods (such as sizzlers, steak and shawarma) and serves a wide variety of curry dishes.

Shops include: the Co-Op, Spar, Wong's Oriental Mart and ReStore Lancaster (which sells sustainable items, clothes and hosts the university's Post Office).

There is a campus **pharmacy** with experts in medicine to help you with minor health concerns. This is open 11am-7pm Monday to Friday.

Other facilities include:

Nature on campus

Our 578-acre campus is situated in green parkland and has received the Green Flag award for the fourteenth year in a row – the international benchmark for the quality of green spaces.

There are more than 25,000 trees and 6.5 miles worth of hedgerows on our campus. The 150-year-old woodland surrounding campus is home to a 2.6-mile Woodland Walk trail, which has multiple entry points around campus. So if you get the chance, do go for a stroll and explore!





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
